Pianist Kang Hyelee was born in Daegu in 1995 and graduated with excellent grades from Yewon School and Seoul Arts High School, while also completing the preparatory school of the Korea National University of Arts and the gifted education center of the Korea National University of Arts. She later entered Seoul National University receiving a scholarship for best performance and graduated with top honors. She is currently studying with Pavel Gililov at Mozarteum.

She made her debut in 2008 through 'Kumho Prodigy Concert' and made herself known through 'E Won Dream Tree Concert', 'Kumho Prodigy Trio VOM' and 'Young Musicians Festival'. While studying at Seoul Arts High School, she was selected as the best performer in every semester and played at the school's Young Artist Concert. In 2012, she performed with Eurasian Philharmonic Orchestra with conductor Geum Nan-sae. In 2013, she was selected as the best performer in school and performed together with the symphony band orchestra celebrating the "60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Seoul Arts High School" with conductor Choi Kyung-hwan. She consistently distinguished herself by winning awards in Korea's leading competitions, including 1<sup>st</sup> prize in Korea Chopin Competition, 1<sup>st</sup> prize in Chung-Ang University Competition, 1<sup>st</sup> prize in Eumyeon Festival Competition, 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in Samik Competition, 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in Ewha-Kyunghyang Concours, 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in Eumak Chunchu Competition, 2<sup>nd</sup> prize in TBC Competition. She has also made her debut overseas by performing at the Asia Pacific International Chopin Piano Competition and winning the Polonaise Prize.

After entering Seoul National University, she won the grand prize at Korea Liszt Competition, holding a solo concert at Yamaha Hall in Korea and at Liszt Museum Concert Hall in Budapest at the invitation of the Hungarian embassy. She was also selected for Youngsan Debut Concert Series in 2015 and Kumho Young Artist in 2017 and successfully held her solo concerts. At the time of graduation, she was nominated as the best performer by the Dean of College of Music, and had a chance to play at the Chosun Ilbo Debut Concert. She was acclaimed for her impressive interpretation of Chopin pieces and her musical ability to express refined sounds and various sentiments.

In addition, she participated in various domestic and international music festivals, including Busan International Music Festival, Eumyeon Summer Festival, International Piano Academy held by Seoul National University, Amalfi Coast Festival, Summer School Bad Reichenhall, Internationale Sommerakademie Universität Mozarteum Salzburg. She expanded her musical knowledge by receiving master classes from renowned professors such as Ronan O'hara, Emanuel Krasovsky, Alexander Korsantia, Bernd Goetzke, Eldar Boris Slutsky, Sergei Babayan, Michel Béroff, Jang Hyeong-jun, Moon Ik-joo, Baek Hye-sun, Park Jong-hwa, Shin Soo-jung, and many others.

In recent years, Kang Hyelee won 1<sup>st</sup> prize at the 2019 Piano Live Battle co-hosted by the Sejong Center for the Performing Arts and the Young Artist Forum & Festival. She passed the regular audition of Mozarteum and was chosen to perform with Bad Reichenhall Orchestra. She won 2<sup>nd</sup> prize at the 2nd Vienna International Competition, both 1<sup>st</sup> prize and Special Prize at Grand Virtuoso Piano Competition, and will hold a concert with orchestra at Italy Festival in June 2021. And Recently, she was selected as one of the semifinalists of the 63rd Busoni Competition and won 3rd prize at the 1st bechstein bruckner competition.
